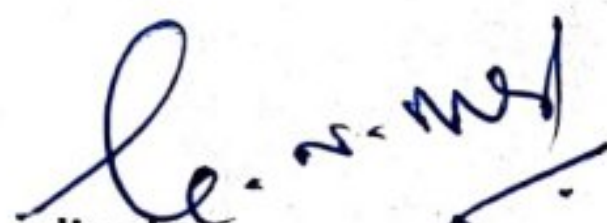

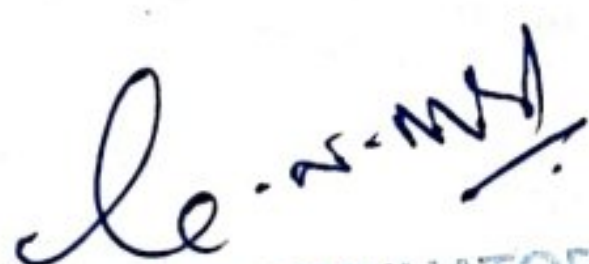

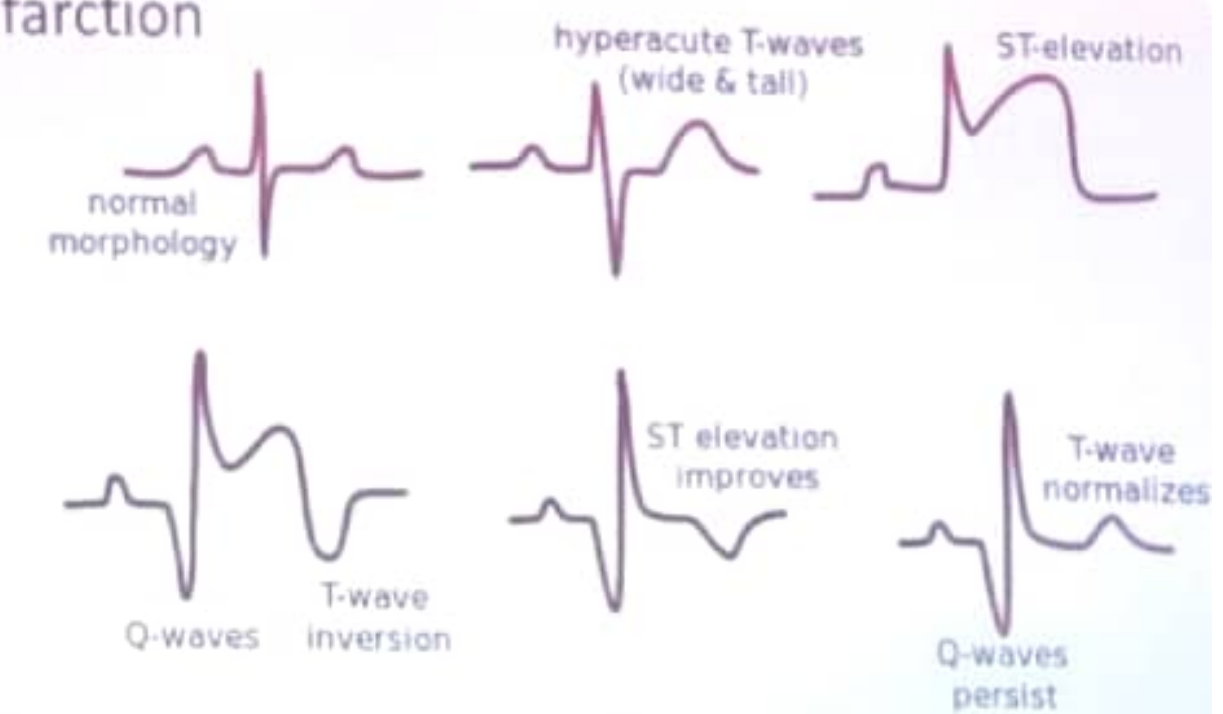

Commission seeking opinion of a panel of doctors

The Karnataka State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (KSCPCR), which conducted the first hearing on three-year-old Mariam Kouser's case of alleged medical negligence, directed doctors to submit her medical records by Monday.

Mudassir Pasha, the girl's father, approached the commission seeking a ban on the doctors of Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Trauma and Orthopaedics (SGITO), who operated on her on December 15. Mariam, who had been admitted to the hospital for injuries on her left elbow, slipped into a coma after she underwent surgery. She was shifted to Dr. Malathi Manipal Hospital, where she is still critical.

Her family members, quoting the medical records, alleged that an overdose of anaesthesia administered by a trainee doctor led to her condition.

'Manipulated documents'

"The doctors did not even measure her weight before administering the anaesthesia, which is mandatory. After this she developed hypoxia (brain damage from lack of oxygen supply). They knew of Mariam's condition, but kept the family in the dark and manipulated the documents to cover up the mess," the family members told the Commission in a petition.
